



The flowers that bloom in the spring

Breathe promise of merry sunshine (The Mikado; Gilbert & Sullivan)



The snowdrops have given a wonderful show this year and now the bright yellow daffodils are trumpeting the arrival of spring with their variety of colours and shapes, doubles and singles, yellows, orange and white; delightful displays in gardens and verges. Alongside the boldness of the daffodils the more demure crocus, primrose and primula add a touch of colour in their own way. The hellebore add their flavour to the spring scene with their deep purples through to brilliant white and dusky yellow. They're a reminder of the changing season as we move from the Christmas Rose to the Lent Rose and they continue to bloom at Easter and beyond.

Looking upwards the blackthorn has been spectacular over the last few days with those pure white flowers against the black stems. Hopefully they will develop into a good crop of sloes later in the year for that winter warmer, sloe gin. The cherry plum is also blossoming and the flowering cherry won't be far behind. The forsythia is beginning to show its colours and a few early varieties are breaking forth into colour, so it won't be long before they are a riot of colour.

The flowers that bloom in the spring do most certainly breathe a promise of merry sunshine and brightness in our gardens, hedgerows and fields.

In our churches we will see a splash of colour in the middle of the month as we celebrate Mothering Sunday with flowers and posies to mark the day. A day also known as Mid-Lent Sunday, a small celebration in the middle of the Lenten discipline of fasting. In some communities Mothering Sunday is celebrated with simnel cake, mothering buns and other delicacies. The day is a celebration of our mothers and our mother church, the Cathedral or the place where we were baptised. It has sadly been taken over by the American and Hallmark Cards feast of Mother's Day, an altogether different event which misses the depth and spiritual meaning we have with Mothering Sunday.

After the celebration of Mothering Sunday the church returns to a deeper keeping of Lent with Passion Sunday leading into Passiontide, the two weeks leading us to Easter, as the Church reflects again on the stories of Christ's passion and death in preparation to celebrate his glorious resurrection at Easter. Passion Sunday is followed by Palm Sunday with donkey processions and the shouts of "Hosanna!" as Christ enters the city of Jerusalem mounted on a donkey. Shouts which, as the gospels remind us, quickly turn to "Crucify!" as we move to Good Friday and Holy Saturday.

Then Easter Day when our churches will be full of flowers and light, music and singing - a great celebration of new life and hope for all as we celebrate again Christ's resurrection.

The beauty of flowers whether in our churches, gardens or hedgerows remind us of the beauty of God's creation but they can only break forth into bloom after a period of hibernation and renewal. They remind us that we too must have some time for our own growth and springing forth; the Church has given us this period of Lent as a time for our renewal. So, I invite you to use the remaining days of Lent to renew and recharge in order that together we can celebrate new life, the merry sunshine of Easter, the light of Christ in the world. *Rob Axford*



Handel Cossham Bicentenary

Son of a joiner and builder, Handel Shepherd Cossham (shown here as a 24 year old and as an



older man) was born in Thornbury exactly two hundred years ago, on 31st March 1824.

Instead of following in his father's footsteps, he became a clerk in a colliery and taught himself about the geology of the local coalfields be-


fore becoming a leading colliery owner in this area and a substantial employer. He was also a lay preacher, temperance advocate, educationalist, politician and public benefactor. It was estimated that 50,000 people were present at the cemetery or lined the route at his funeral.

Cossham never forgot his native town. In 1862 he paid for the setting up of a British School at Gillingstool, and then, in 1888, he donated the former Wesleyan Chapel building to the people of Thornbury for use as a public hall.

"Handel Cossham - Thornbury's Man of Substance" is the first exhibition of 2024 at Thornbury and District Museum.

The Museum is next door to the Cossham Hall in Chapel Street and the new exhibition includes the story of the Cossham Hall – the Wesleyan Chapel he donated to the town – one of its most historic buildings. Museum opening hours are currently Tuesdays and Fridays 1 - 4pm and Saturdays 10am - 4pm. Entry is free. All are welcome!





We have had a Ukrainian, Mykola, living with us since the beginning of September.

He would like his niece, aged twenty-four, and his nephew to come over to England. His niece lives in Kyiv, which has been subject to missile attacks. She says it was a beautiful city before the war. Anya has very good English as she works from home for an American firm. She could continue her job in England providing she has a good internet connection.

Mykola's nephew is 16 years old. He has had his schooling interrupted by frequent air raid sirens, meaning that pupils need to take shelter. He is a bright lad who wishes to further his education leading to a university place.

I am wondering if anyone either in or near Cromhall would be willing to offer accommodation to either of these young people?

They would come over on the Homes for Ukraine scheme run by South Glos Council in cooperation with several charities.

Sheila Hook 1932 - 2023

With the death of Sheila Hook last December, Falfield has lost one of its key contributors to village life over a long period of time. She arrived in the village following her marriage to Arthur Hook in 1953 and worked alongside him at Whitfield Gate Farm for many years before the move to Brook Farm, Tortworth, and later to Cove Cottage.

Sheila Jane Bosworth was born at Chavenage Farm on 23rd March 1932 to Elton and Alice where she joined her brothers, John and Peter. From there she first attended school in Tetbury and then, after the family's move to Field Farm,

Coaley, she went to primary school in the village before moving on to Dursley Grammar School and then on to work in the wages department at Mawdsley's.



Village life for many young people in the early post-war period centred on local dances and it was at a dance at the Lister Hall in Dursley that Sheila and Arthur met. The couple were soon the proud parents of three sons, Graham, Roger and Robert who occupied much of Sheila's time and energy, but she was keen to maintain her social activities in the village and in the wider community.

One of Sheila's key interests was the Women's Institute (she was a member of Falfield WI for over seventy years) through which she became involved in both competing and judging at local produce and agricultural shows. Her competitive

disposition was not confined to entering shows, however, and her family can bear testimony to her determination to win at family games. Gardening was another of her passions, as was clear to passers-by when she moved to Cove Cottage where her immaculate summer garden was a joy to see.

Sheila was also a loyal supporter of the church who became involved in a variety of roles, most notably with the Sunday School, and for many years she used her skills as a flower arranger every week to decorate the windows either side of the memorial to those men from Falfield who had died in World War II. Her contribution to the wider community was also evident through the League of Friends of Thornbury Hospital where she served on the committee for over forty years.

Amongst her other hobbies, Sheila enjoyed painting, badminton and keeping fit. The enthusiasm for Keep Fit sessions at Thornbury Leisure Centre was well publicised when a life-sized action-shot of her in full-stretch was displayed across an entire wall in the entrance foyers of many leisure centres in the area.

Sheila was a realist with a keen sense of humour who was prepared to face the inevitable, so six years ago she wrote her own eulogy entitled, "When I Kick the Bucket"; Her family think it may have been because she was dubious about what they might say about her, but those who knew her are well aware that she needn't have worried!
